OCTOBER 21st, 7pm online - Kathy Wylie

Kathy is a multiple international-award winning quilter specializing in appliqué, quilt design, domestic machine quilting and English Paper Piecing techniques. She started sewing and embroidering as a young girl, laying the foundation for the life-altering discovery of quilting two decades later. Over the past twenty-five years, quilting has grown from a hobby into a full-time creative career.



Kathy's quilt designs have received recognition in Canada as well as internationally. Her quilt 'Instruments of Praise' earned the 2011 Bernina Machine Workmanship Award from the American Quilter's Society and now resides in the U.S. National Quilt Museum as part of its permanent collection. Her most recent quilt 'For Such a Time as This' has received multiple awards, including the AQS Best of Show at the 2018 Fall Paducah Quilt-Week and the CQA/ACC Best of Show at Quilt Canada 2019.



Her lecture at the October meeting is 'The Art of Appliqué' and it is all about appliqué! Do you marvel over beautiful appliquéd quilts and wonder how they were accomplished? You might be surprised at the number of techniques and methods that can be used to create these masterpieces. This lecture will give you some insight into the various types of appliqué along with stunning photographs. You are not going to want to miss this lecture.




Internet Resources for Quilters

Kimberly Jolly, from the Fat Quarter Shop has just introduced a new free Block of the Week Quilt Along. She will be joined by 18 talented fabric designers who will bring a 38 week quilt along with amazing sampler blocks, tips, strategies and ideas. A new block is released every Friday starting Fri. Sept. 25 and ending Fri. June 25, 2021. Kimberly will share her block along with tips and strategies on her YouTube Livestream video which is released the same day as each new block. Participating fabric designers will also post their block on the same day. The free pattern for each block is available in 3 inch, 6 inch or 9 inch blocks. Tiny Houses at Lot 42 - Quilts Needed!

As many of you are aware, we have a village of tiny houses located in an industrial area here in Kitchener, known as "A Better Tent City". These units house people in our community who would otherwise be on the street. As the cold weather begins, we see a need that the WCQG can fill, namely quilts! We need about 35 new single bed-sized quilts to be distributed to the occupants of the tiny houses. The quilts should measure approx. 60" x 80" and can be any colour or pattern, tied or quilted. They will be given to these community members to keep.

I don't know about you, but I have some quilts that will nicely fit this bill hiding in my closet. You know the ones I mean—that block exchange, quilt along or block of the month that was really fun to make, but somehow the colours don't work with your decor or you don't have a bed that size anymore and you've run out of deserving relatives.

What about that bundle of fat quarters and the new technique you've been wanting to try? Your efforts will be appreciated like a warm hug this winter.

You are welcome to contact me, Marg Sandiford, via email or phone (this information is in your handbook) if you have a quilt or two that I could come by and pick up, or you could drop off at my home.

The temperature has already dropped almost to zero in the last couple of weeks at night, so it is imperative that we act quickly to keep these folks warm.

Judy Siegner has batting available for these quilts. **Please contact Judy if you are able to quilt some tops for this effort.** I look forward to hearing from you and co-ordinating this accumulation of quilts for a good cause. - Marg Sandiford



Local Quilters Support Community Organizations

In anticipation of the opening of the new Gies Family Centre Hospice on University Avenue in Waterloo, 28 quilts, table runners and wall hangings will be gifted by the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild.

All quilted items have been made and donated by members of the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild through the guild's PAL program. PAL is one of several outreach programs of the nearly 250 member guild. Other outreach projects include Smile, Touch and Memory.

The presentation on Thursday afternoon is only one of the hospice centres that have received quilts. These PAL quilts support palliative and friendship needs in the community. Donations also go to Hospice Homes, Lisaard, Innisfree, Wellington and Waterloo, Vera's Place as well as other venues as the need arises. New initiatives include St. Mary's Hospital for palliative care and the Tiny Homes at Lot 42 in Kitchener. These quilts are meant to provide comfort to individuals and their families while in residence at a hospice. The quilts may be gifted to the families or kept by the hospice for future use on the beds.

In the five years this program has been in existence, the number of quilts donated yearly has steadily increased from 22 to 70 in this past year. In the last two years the guild has provided financial support for batting and backing. Members willingly contribute their own fabrics, time and expertise in an effort to provide comfort during a time of need.

Smile quilts are donated to the Pediatric Outpatient Clinic at Grand River Hospital and are given to children undergoing treatment for cancer or other serious illnesses, to provide comfort and warmth. This past year 182 quilts were delivered to the hospital to be given to children.

Memory quilts are donated to Grand River Hospital's Bereavement Program and are given to those families who have lost an infant to stillbirth, SIDS or some other catastrophe. Thirty quilts were provided this past year.

The Touch Quilt Program run by the KW Alzheimer Society provides individuals with later stage Alzheimer's Disease and related dementia an item of comfort to hold and touch with their hands.

This past year, our guild members accepted a guild challenge to "Brighten Someone's Day" by creating table runners. Nearly 100 table runners were donated to the PAL program and subsequently delivered to Hospices. Some remain available for future needs.

The guild has also donated nearly 15,000 home-made cloth masks to a wide variety of community organizations. In partnership with the Waterloo Days for Girls organization, an additional 4,000 masks have been donated to Indigenous Communities locally and in Northern Ontario.

The Waterloo County Quilters' Guild continues to be a busy and active guild in pursuit of always discovering something new about the art of quilting and making a difference.

**Kathy Wylie – Birth Flower Appliquéd Class
November 4, 10 and 17th**

Kathy Wylie will be leading an exciting workshop starting on November 4th – ***Birth Flower Appliquéd***. In this workshop, you will make a birth flower block of your choice using needle-turn, Apliquick, or fusible appliquéd methods along with hand and machine stitching techniques. This workshop is suitable for all levels.

This workshop will take place over three sessions to allow you plenty of time in between the sessions to work on your block:

Session #1 – November 4, 2020 – 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. – Choosing & Prepping Fabrics

Session #2 – November 10, 2020 – 9:30 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. – Sewing

Session # 3 – November 17, 2020 – 9:30 – 10:30 – Finishing Up

Cost of the Workshop - \$56.50 (including taxes) and you will be required to purchase the Birth Flower Block of the Month pattern of your choice from Kathy's website - \$14.95 plus tax and shipping – total \$19.08. All registrants will be given a 15% off coupon to Kathy's online store that can be used when purchasing the pattern (and anything else you might see that you like in her online store). This will come in a separate email from the Program Committee after you have registered and paid for the workshop.

Supply List – A detailed supply list will be sent to you upon registration at the online store. If you have any questions email wcqgprogram@gmail.com

NOTE – Minimum number of students – 10 (must be registered before October 23rd) and maximum of 20. The deadline for placing orders for the pattern with Kathy is October 23rd. We will notify everyone who registers as soon as we have 10 students registered for the workshop. In the event we do not have the minimum number of students, the workshop will be cancelled and refunds issued for the workshop fee.

Sewing Together, But Apart Days

Spend the day "together" sharing and learning, while staying safe.

The Sewing Together, But Apart (STBA) Days were introduced in May and June as a way to help keep our members connected socially, get to know other members of the guild, become more confident in the use of Zoom, share ideas and strategies, learn new skills from a speaker and basically have some fun. Come and spend an entire day together – or join the group for part of the day.

Our first STBA Day for this guild year will take place on Thursday, October 15 – 9:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. A fun day is being planned. We will begin by coming together as a group at 9:00 a.m., where the agenda for the day will be shared. Some of the activities throughout the day will include:

- Meeting in small groups called “Break-out Rooms” where you will be able to share the project you are working on with a smaller group or share a favorite tool, etc.
- Watching an interesting video together while on-line – topic to be shared soon
- At 1:00 p.m. Michelle Banton, from Massachusetts, will join us to share her special lecture on “quilting hacks”. She will share 100 every day items found in your home that can be used in your day to day quilting activities.
- Some sewing time on your own is provided throughout the day.
- At 3:20 – we will come together as a group to wrap up the day’s events.

To register for this sewing event, please go to the guild’s website and click on the “on-line store”. Follow the information to register.

You will receive a confirmation and more information about the day, Zoom support, log-in information, etc. prior to the STBA Day.

This year through our STBA Days we are embracing this unique opportunity that Zoom can provide us in that we are reaching out and inviting guest speakers from across North America to present a lecture in the early afternoon. This is something that we have not been able to do in the past due to cost and distance, but it is such an exciting opportunity to expand our horizons and learn from quilt teachers from around the world. Because we are incurring an expense for the speaker, a fee of \$10 is requested which will help to cover some of the cost for the speaker. The guild has also provided a small budget to help off-set/cover a portion of the speaker’s fee. Hopefully this will help to explain the reason for the cost of these sessions. For the months when no speaker is provided, there will not be a cost involved.

We are looking forward to a fun day on October 15th. Hope you can join us. We plan to host a STBA Day once a month. It is a great way to get to know fellow guild members, learn, share and have some fun. Hope to see you there!




How cool is this! Thread made from recycled plastic water bottles. One bottle can produce 1000m of thread!

SMILE Quilts

The Smile Bee Virtual Day will be held on **Saturday, November 14th**. We will make or finish all sizes of Smile Quilts on that day at home, but through Zoom. There is no charge for the day. The request forms for backing and batting are found on the WCQG site (not in the newsletter). If you scroll down on the "Home" page to the bottom right corner, there are a number of PDF forms in blue. The Smile & PAL Quilts request form is the last one. Click on "Community Outreach Page". The instructions to complete the form are at the top with the colour choices for backings at the bottom. Please follow the directions carefully. All forms are to be emailed to Helene Doerfler (her email is on the form). I made a mistake in the September newsletter.

You can make your own labels or check off the box on the form and a label will be included in your bundle. Please drop off the finished quilt at Peggy Herlick's home.

We retrieved the backing and batting from the community room so the first cutting date is October 20th. You can pick up your order from Marilyn Weckworth, 16 Muskoka Court, Kitchener on or about October 21st. This means that you need to get the forms to Helene by October 19th, at the very latest. There will be other cutting days in the future, but to ensure you have what you need for the Bee Day, please order before October 19th.


Hospice Wellington Receives PAL Quilts
