formative and humorous perspective on her quilt challenge experiences, including a trunk and slide show. Diane's quilting adventure has been long and varied, including delusions of grandeur, some epic fails, a few triumphs, many "good enoughs" and most importantly, increasingly satisfying results. The stories that go along with her quilts are equal to the




warmth and smiles they bring. Diane will discuss what she has learned from the various challenges, other ways to challenge yourself, and sources of inspiration. And most importantly, Diane will discuss how challenges can expand your quilting skills and inspire all your quilting!



Diane began as a traditional quilter in the late 90's, gradually modifying patterns and gravitating to art quilts, specifically participating in art quilt challenges. Her quilts are included in three published books and multiple special exhibits traveling the USA, including Houston's International Quilt Festival. Diane retired in 2016 after a 32-year career as a Department of Army civilian and now has time to be more creative and explore quilting on even more new levels! Diane and her husband, Tim, are certified foster parents and enjoy RVing.

Ode to Lavallée

art KWilt connection llene Atkins, Dorothy Holdenmeyer, Judy Pearce, Nancy Winn, Marg Notar WATERLOO, ONTARIO, CANADA

Our group of five art quilters from southwestern Ontario had been collaborating on the design and completion of art quilts for a few years when we learned of a call for entry to celebrate Canada's 150th anniversary in 2017. Challenge accepted! Ideas flowed toward the theme of our national anthem, so we set out to research inspiration for potential visual components. As a result, we got consent from Milton Glaser, the New York-based graphic artist (think, "I heart NY") to adapt his 1979 "Sony Tape. Full Color Sound" poster, featuring the score from Beethoven's 5th Symphony highlighted by watercolour landscapes. From there, we had Spoonflower print the score to "O Canada" (written by Calixa Lavallée in 1880) on white cotton, then one at a time, we each used fabric inks, Inktense pencils and Neocolor crayons to paint images of our designated section of Canada, from the North (top) to the East (bottom), then added stitching to our section. Much breath-holding ensued, since making a mistake would spoil the whole project for the group. A final set of quilting added maple leaves around the borders and throughout the design. Music to our ears!

QUILT ENTRY REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

ACCESSING the Entry Form:

The Entry Form can be printed from the guild website (<u>www.wcquiltersguild.on.ca</u>), and filled out manually to be handed in at Gatherings **OR** it can be opened on your computer as a Word document (.doc).

Printing the form to fill in by hand: Please note that the shaded areas in the Word document do not show when the page is printed. You will have blank areas to fill out. The form is also available as a PDF.

To complete the form (Word format only) on your computer: just type in the shaded areas, which will expand as needed. To save it, name the document with your last name, entry category and number (i.e., Smith_LW_#1). Then, email it to margsandiford@hotmail.com as an attachment.

COMPLETING the Entry Form:

Each WCQG member may enter a maximum of 4 items in the exhibit, plus your entry in the President's Challenge. Of the 4 items, up to 2 may be in a single category.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED: Pre-printed whole cloth or printed panel entries with no additional piecing or appliqué, unfinished items, quilts without properly secured and/or sized hanging sleeves, and quilts that "replace" quilts officially entered. You will also be required to provide a hanging rod for Small Quilts (as described above).

SUBMITTING the Entry Form:

THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING YOUR ENTRY FORMS AND PHOTOS IS JUNE 30, 2023

QUILT ENTRY REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)

For each submission, indicate in the Re/Subject line: your last name, entry category and number, (i.e.,Smith_LW_#1). Attach your entry form and please use a separate email message for each entry. Completion and submission of an entry form constitutes permission to photograph for publicity, and by visitors to the exhibit.

Completion and submission of an entry form is a commitment to delivering the entry item listed on October 12, and to having it displayed for the duration of the exhibit, October 13 & 14, 2023.

PHOTOGRAPHY FOR THE QUILT EXHIBIT: Everyone is responsible for taking their own pictures and sending them to Marg Sandiford at margsandiford@hotmail.com .This must be a straight-on picture, not artistically arranged. This will be used by Kathy to decide where your piece fits with all the other entries. Please ensure that the quilt is being photographed is the one you registered, and is photographed with the best lighting and quality possible.

Photographs need to be emailed to Marg no later than June 30, 2023.

QUILT DISPLAY AT THE EXHIBIT: The Quilt Display Co-ordinator will select entries for the exhibit based on the space available for display; therefore, some quilts may be folded over quilt racks. Ideally the goal is to have each member represented in the exhibit. You will be contacted should any of your quilts not be required due to space limitations.

WCQG and RIM Park assume no liabilities, and cannot be responsible in the unlikely event of damage or loss of personal items used for the exhibit. The rooms used for the quilt exhibit will be locked when the exhibit is not in progress.

EMPTY SPOOLS

This note was received by Kerry Johnson regarding the empty spools that have been collected so far:

"Hello Kerry, Thank you so much for the spools! I picked them up yesterday from the post office. I appreciate your sending and collection them!

Currently my Grade 1 students use them as 'STEM' materials to build things and complete challenges. Last year, my grade 4/5 students used them to create pulley systems, and one student made models of fingers to demonstrate arthritis. Basically, we use them however we can!" - Jennifer Owen

Quilt Exhibit 2023 Volunteers Needed

Your Quilt Exhibit Committee has been working to prepare for the 2023 Exhibit. The Exhibit starts on Friday, October 13 and continues to Saturday October 14. In order to be a successful showing of our combined talents, there is a lot of work required for it to be a great exhibit. <u>We need volunteers.</u> The more hands we have to do the tasks, the better it will be for all involved. Volunteers are needed early Thursday morning (or Wednesday evening, if access to the building is allowed), and to unload the racks and other equipment from the rental truck, and bring them into the building at RIM Park. Loading and unloading the truck is heavy work. Young and strong volunteers are needed for these tasks. We have talked about asking high school family members. Students should be able to count the work as part of their service hours, as long as we have someone designated to sign their forms.

We need step ladders—8', 10' & 12', as well as couple of shorter ones. Volunteers who bring the ladders should be able (or bring someone with them who is able) to use the ladder. Please put your name on your ladder.

There is a brief job description on many of the sign-up sheets that will be available at Gatherings in April, May and June. - Hanging the quilts—Thursday, two time slots: 10am-2pm or 1pm-5pm
- Take-down of quilts—Saturday, 5:00pm
- Quilt rack dismantling and loading the rental truck on Saturday, beginning at 5:00pm
- Quilt return—Saturday 6:00pm




