




Welcome to the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild's Virtual Show and Tell for our April 2020 cancelled Guild Meeting.





These are my Modern Pojagi pieces. They really aren't quilts though as they are to be used as a window decoration, and this will be taken to the cottage eventually.






Here are two smile quilts that I have finished off while I have been home working. I am fortunate to be able to work from home.


Misty Pines (56 x 70), designed by Patti Carey of Northcott Pattern was published in the January/February 2013 McCall's Quilting magazine.
