

'Hashtags' and '@mentions' are commonly used on social media platforms to categorize content and connect with other users. Here's a brief explanation of how they work:



Hashtags:

A hashtag is a work or phrase that is preceded by the "#" symbol, buch as #wcquiltersguild #quilting #quiltguild. Hashtags are used to categorize content so that other users can easily find posts on specific topics. When you click on a hashtag, you'll see all of the posts that have been tagged with that hashtag, regardless of whether or not you follow the accounts that posted them. This is a great way to connect with other accounts with similar interests.

Tips for using hashtags:

- Use relevant hashtags that are related to your content
- Keep your hashtags concise and easy to read
- You are allowed up to 30 hashtags on one post, but I wouldn't do that on every post!
- Avoid using hashtags that are overly generic or spammy, try to be specific

Good hashtags to use:

#wquiltersguild #canadianquilter #quiltersofinstagram #quilting #quiltingontario #modernquilting #traditionalquilting #quiltblock #quiltpattern

@ mentions:

An '@ mention' is when you include someone's username (preceded by the "@" symbol) in a post or comment. This is a way to tag or notify specific users that you're talking to or about them. When you mention someone, they'll receive a notification that they've been tagged, and the post or comment will appear in their 'mentions' tab. Tips for using @ mentions:

- Use @ mentions to tag other users who you want to engage with or to whom you want to give credit. You can
 use @wcquiltersguild
- Use @ mentions to get someone's attention, ask a question, or start a conversation
- Don't overuse @ mentions or spam other users with notifications
- Double check that you've tagged the correct username before you post.



One member of the group will enter the quilt but that member will still be allowed to enter 4 of their own quilts,



Quilt Exhibit 2023 Volunteers Needed

Your Quilt Exhibit Committee has been working to prepare for the 2023 Exhibit. The Exhibit starts on Friday, October 13 and continues to Saturday October 14. In order to be a successful showing of our combined talents, there is a lot of work required for it to be a great exhibit. We need volunteers. The more hands we have to do the tasks, the better it will be for all involved. Volunteers are needed early Thursday morning (or Wednesday evening, if access to the building is allowed), to unload the racks and other equipment from the rental truck, and bring them into the building at RIM Park. Loading and unloading the truck is heavy work. Young and strong volunteers are needed for these tasks. We have talked about asking high school family members. Students should be able to count the work as part of their service hours, as long as we have someone designated to sign their forms.

We need step ladders—8', 10' & 12', as well as couple of shorter ones. Volunteers who bring the ladders should be able (or bring someone with them who is able) to use the ladder. Please put your name on your ladder.

There is a brief job description on many of the sign-up sheets that will be available at Gatherings in May and June. If you are unable to sign up at Gatherings, please email Linda Henderson Ighenders@gmail.com or phone her at 519-886-9927 to tell her the task and time slot for which you'd like to sign up.

- Cleaning and building the white PVC quilt racks— Thursday 8:30am. A white rubber mallet would be useful,

- Quilt take-in—Thursday 7:00am
- Hanging the quilts—Thursday, two time slots: 10am-2pm or 1pm-5pm
- Take-down of quilts—Saturday, 5:00pm
- Quilt rack dismantling and loading the rental truck on Saturday, beginning at 5:00pm
- Quilt return—Saturday 6:00pm








Library Update






