

Your Smile Committee is organizing our annual spring Bee Day at the Community Centre in Mannheim Park and everyone is welcome.



We will have an appointment system set up for you to get the photos done as efficiently as possible, at Creative Sisters. Please be sure to have your completed entry available for photography in July. If you intend to be away during July, please have a "buddy" get the pictures taken for you. Fun New Opportunity




We have been contacted by the Coordinator of the Children's and Teen Services at the Kitchener Public Library (KPL). We are being asked to create quilt squares for the wall of the newly renovated children's department. I have copied the initial request below. The executive discussed this at our March meeting and we have agreed this would, indeed, be a project we would like to be part of. Let me (Judy Pearce) know if you would like to help with this project.

"As you may know, the Main Library in Kitchener is currently under construction. As part of our expansion and renovation project, we will be adding many new features to the library. In the Children's Area we are adding what we call a Feature Wall. It is an interactive, early learning space which will welcome families to the department. We are working with a great company from California on this feature.

Our goal is to make it fun and memorable, it will be very modern, but we also want it to represent our community. When working on the plans for what would be included, the idea of creating a measurement device was discussed. This will mean that every time children visit the library they can measure their height, and hopefully find themselves growing with the library.

The company suggested that we use real items as measurement indicators. So, we set about trying to decide what items would be both visually interesting and representative of our community. We came up with three things: buttons, maple leaves, and quilt squares. A child could, for example, be 40 buttons or 12 leaves or 4 quilt squares tall. "



Small Quilt Draw for the Quilt Show

This should not be confused with the large quilt draw for the beautiful gray /red sophisticated one designed by Marilyn F. and Marsha C. This appeal is for small quilts no bigger than 60 inches for the whole perimeter, preferably with a hanging device. We hang 20--25 per day if enough are donated and people at the show buy a ticket which they drop into a bag that is number to match the number on the quilt. At the end of the day a ticket is drawn from each of the bags to be the winners.

Proceeds help meet the cost of the show.



So you can try out an interesting block, or use a left over one from one already made. Baby or young children motif are often favourites. Cats quilts were popular last year. Bring them in as you finish them but of course your big quilts for displaying at the show are your first priority.


Taking the Mystery Out of the Four-Patch




Quick and Easy Four-Patches




1) To make four-patches quickly, you will be starting with two squares of the same size. To allow for quarter-inch seam allowances, cut your squares half an inch larger than you wish to have your finished four-patch blocks.




2) Place the two fabric squares right sides together and sew with a quarter-inch seam allowance on opposite sides.




3) Cut this unit in half parallel to your sewing lines.




4) Press toward the darker fabric.





5) Place the two units right sides together with opposite fabrics together.



6) Once again, sew with a quarter-inch seam allowance on opposite sides.



7) Once again, cut this unit in half parallel to your sewing lines.



8) Open and press the two four-patches blocks.

This is a particularly good method to use if you are making a scrappy quilt. All you need are multiple squares of the same size.
