A quilting and fiber arts enthusiast, Krista has been teaching sewing and quilting for more than 20 years. She has published forty patterns since 2016 and is the designer

of the Creative Grids 60 Degree Diamond rulers. Her work has been featured in quilting magazines published by Martingale Press and hung in prominent quilt shops around the USA.





Fabric Postcards

The guild is accepting donations of quilted postcards to be used by our secretary, Doris Martin. Donated postcards will need to meet the following criteria to be able to be used in the secretary's work:

- They must be on card stock, with no fabric on the back, to allow for a hand-written message
- Each postcard must be accompanied by a correctly sized envelope that will properly fit the postcard, to ensure confidentiality for the recipient



• The envelope must be not larger than 9" x 6" and no thicker than 0.2" with the postcard inside (the minimum size according to Canada Post is 5.6" x 6.1", with a thickness of 0.007"



Donations of postcards are to be brought to the parking lot behind Albert McCormick Arena's community centre on the monthly drop-off/pick-up days for library books and the guild's various community outreach initiatives.

Her lecture in the afternoon will focus on "*My Favorite Quilting Notions*" where she will highlight, explain and share a wide variety of quilting notions and how they will benefit our quilting hobby. Carolina's energy is infectious and her knowledge extensive. She is a sought-after speaker, sharing her presentations across the continent.

We have another great opportunity to highlight and feature four presenters from our own guild. Each month in the spring in the mornings at our STBA days, we will invite one of the International Quilting Day 2022 speakers to share their presentations. In March, Gail Berry-Graham will join us and will share her lecture "Grid work, Not Guesswork". Gail is our current vice-president. She is also a professional long-arm quilter and international teacher. She teaches piecing, techniques and quilting classes. Her travels have allowed her to share her quilting passion and quilts throughout much of North America, Australia and Germany. Gail is a Handi Quilter Educator and Superior Threads Educator. Her lecture will address laying out quilting designs using grid-work that will create even spacing and uniformity in quilting. In her session, participants will learn how to make their own stencils, explore quilting designs that work well within grids, plus some tips and tricks for marking grids on your next quilting project.


