


Welcome to the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild's October 2023 Virtual Show and Share.



# **Our Log Cabin Mobile**

Twenty years ago at the Joseph Schneider Haus, my daughter, Tara, and I had the opportunity to have a show together called *Kindred Threads*. A third of the works were Tara's, a third mine and the final third were our collaborative works. I have finally gained custody of this mobile! Tara created the glass centres and I applied the surrounding wonky reversible log cabin blocks and assembled them with fishing line. The blocks are approximately 5½" square. We are thrilled to be sharing it again.






Bag with a variation of machine stitches, combined with hand stitches

This little bag (15 x 18 cm) is made with her technique. I didn't use many different stitches, but tried to use the same stitch with different lengths and widths.

I enjoyed adding the hand-stitches, particularly to alter the machine stitches.

#### **Four Seasons**

Wool on linen quilt based on the pattern *Round the* Garden by Wendy Williams. I reworked three of the quadrants creating a summer, winter, spring and fall theme. The quilt is all hand stitched with wool and embroidery. I learnt so many new embroidery stitches and utilized the instruction of Sue Spargo on many of the designs. Wool is such a forgiving medium to work and the beautiful bright colours always bring a pop to the quilt. The quilt did not require a lot of quilting as the work itself was the feature. A stipple background on most of the areas did the trick. The only difficult part of the job was that it is worked as a whole quilt and the size of the top could cause a few problems. To eliminate this issue I chose to divide the whole cloth into two sections right down the middle. Custom machine quilted by Susan Therrien.

#### **Tahoe**

In recent years, I had noticed and grown to admire Edyta Sitar – Laundry Basket Quilts patterns and really love the fabric collections. I was also starting to feel a little "bored" with half square triangle and flying geese, and began to think of how I could stretch and challenge my piecing/quilting skills. Edyta designed and made this 'Tahoe' quilt for her daughter's wedding. When I saw it, I knew that it was the special guilt I wanted to make to honour my husband and my 40th anniversary in December. One problem – I had never made diamonds before and really didn't know how to go about it – my quilting friends also did not know how to make diamonds – so after some research and YouTube, I set to work taking the beautiful fabric and piecing it into diamonds, all of which I found quite challenging and a real stretch for me. After 7 months, (taking a month off for Christmas), I was able to complete the guilt top and am very pleased with how the quilt turned out. Special thanks to Barbara Pye for the beautiful long arm quilting to complete the project.
