

February Program -Wednesday, February 21, 2024 7pm ET on Zoom "Quilting Journey of a Renaissance Woman" with Sue Sherman

We are delighted to have fibre artist Sue Sherman for our February guild meeting! Sue will present her lecture and slide show, "Quilting Journey of a Renaissance Woman". She will cover her quilting journey, starting with traditional pieced quilts, and will include her time living in Hawaii, where she learned traditional Hawaiian quilting. The bulk of the presentation will cover her more recent realistic animal



quilts, which she creates by painting with thickening dyes onto white cotton, and extensive machine thread painting/quilting.

Sue's work is inspired by her own photographs of animals from around the world. She has travelled to all seven continents, both through her earlier work as an engineer, and more recently, on trips with a specific aim to observe animals in their natural habitat.

Sue has won awards for her work at national and international events, including the \$5000 Superior Threads Award for Thread Artistry at the 2022 Houston International Quilt Festival. She has been a Juried Artist Member of the Studio Art Quilt Association since 2019, and her work has been featured in industry magazines in Canada



and the USA.

- Use card stock for the back (fabric is too difficult to write on).
- Each postcard must be accompanied by a correctly sized envelope that will properly fit the postcard, to insure confidentiality for the recipient.
- The envelope must be no larger than 9" x 6", and no thicker than .02" with the postcard inside (minimum size according to Canada Post is 5.6" x 6.1" with a thickness of 0.007").

Please drop off your donations of postcards at Gatherings beginning in October—there will be a labelled basket or box on the sign-in table at the entrance for you to leave your postcards. - Doris Martin.

Sewing Together, But Apart - February 14, 2024

The February STBA day takes place on Valentine's Day. What a great way to celebrate it! Join a group of quilting friends, learn some new quilt strategies, and have some fun socializing.

Our day will feature two guest speakers. The mystery speaker we have hinted at in the morning will be our own Barbara Pye. She will share the presentation on how to create a collage hibiscus flower. The finished product can be used as a postcard, trivet, block for a quilt or a wall hanging, etc. If you



saw this presentation on the cruise, seeing it again will be a good opportunity to ask any additional questions, create a second one, or just review the technique. For those who would prefer something else, we will also provide a special video in a break-out room that will feature an inter-

view with Freddy Moran. Freddy is an internationally recognized, awardwinning artist, author, and teacher. She began quilting when she was 60 years old. Since that time, she has created countless guilts, all with her signature 'joie de vivre'. She is now 93, and still quilts every day. (A link to this video will be included with the link to the recordings of both speakers to be sent out to participants following the STBA day.)

In the afternoon, we will welcome Barbara Craceffa from Boston, who will share her lecture focusing on how to use fabric panels, large-scale floral prints, and /or geometrics in a new way



to create unique wall hangings, table linens, door banners, or bed-sized quilts. She will share a variety of strategies and ideas for collage, cut 'n paste, fracture, along with embellishment techniques, and so much more.


