My Library Learning Challenge topic is modern quilts. My fat quarter was orange (which I like very much). It is the second, fourth, seventh and tenth strip as well as the binding. The other strips were from my scraps. The background and backing were a half-yard piece from a white and off-white bundle. The quilting is straight vertical lines by machine using painter's tape to keep this straightish (I wasn't perfect).

I read five books and leafed through several others and could not find a definition of a modern quilt. I could list characteristics that are inconsistently suggested in these books, but I could not be brief. The only thing that was consistent in the books I saw was there were no borders. Very often, there was a lot of negative space and lack of symmetry though.

This quilt was an almost copy of one in Modern Minimal 20 Bold Graphic Quilts by Alissa Haight Carlton. Hers was blue and white and called Drips. My husband takes an interest in my crafts and selected the white fabric and size which is a wall hanging that is $201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by 16 ". He also named it. He likes it even though it isn't blue.


This is a quilt I made for the Library Learning Challenge. I picked a modern quilt for this challenge. The pattern was from the book Modern Quilts Illustrated \#9. This pattern is by Weeks Ringle \& Bill Kerr of Modern Quilt Studio. I learned that I do like Modern quilts! 41" x 48"

## Crumb Quilted Tulip Table Runner

I attended a Royal City Quilters Guild Workshop taught by Brita Nelson. Brita taught the crumb quilting method using her Tulip Table Runner Pattern. The resulting table runner has 3 tulips and leaves using crumb fabric. The crumb fabric was made by sewing different red and green scraps of fabric together to form a new fabric $33 " \times 15 "$

Log Cabin Blues - This quilt top came to me in a bag with one and a half inch strips already cut and many of the centres already assembled. It even had a couple of notes regarding strip lengths. There are 17 pieces in each of these blocks. It required a lot of pressing and sorting into sizes and shades, to say nothing of the actual piecing. My friend, Dianne Robertson, also a member of The Caring Connection and I worked on this over a couple of sessions. We decided we liked making the log cabin blocks, but next time we'd like wider strips! It measures $34^{\prime \prime} \times 80$ " and is a PAL quilt.

The small quilt, made from 4 leftover blocks and piano key strips is a Teddy Bear Quilt and measures about 27" x 27".


Pastel Leaders and Enders - I began piecing together 4 patches with charm squares and discovered it wouldn't be big enough, even with the 2" white border. I then proceeded to make 16 patch blocks. I miscalculated the number of these I would need to expand the quilt, making 80 blocks. I used what I needed for this one, and had plenty left over to make a SMILE quilt, that is yet to be quilted. It will go to the Compass Refugee Centre.
