

Perhaps our first few quilting projects were a bit stressful, but once beyond those initial experiences, the health benefits become quite clear. For any who struggle with anxiety and/or depression, having something creative to do with our hands and minds is a huge way to relieve anxiety. Plus we get a little boost of confidence and pride when a project is completed.

When working on a quilt, we are also playing with geometry - (whether or not we realize it) - colourful, patterned geometry. We cut at a variety of angles, problem solve, work with fractions of all sizes, sew things together, piece blocks, - it's all an exercise in math. Plus, looking at the different colours of fabrics and matching colour values is stimulating for the brain. As we work with a variety of different patterns, we get into a rhythm with the blocks, which results in stretching our memory for repeating patterns. It's wonderful to have a fun, enjoyable hobby that also brings health benefits.

As members of our guild this year, we can look forward to learning new skills through the speakers at our monthly meetings, the various workshops that have been planned, the sewing circles at Mannheim and the community created through our guild membership. We are anticipating an exciting Quilt Exhibit in October and later in the year recognizing and celebrating the Guild's 35th Anniversary.

The Executive members (pictured on page one) look forward to working with the membership to make this a wonderful year filled with happy quilting experiences!

Information for the Quilters who are putting quilts in the Quilt Exhibit 2019

1. At the September meeting you will pick up the 3 ID slips needed for each of your quilts.

One is to be pinned to your quilt, the second to your pillowcase and the third is your receipt.

No plastic bags.

Please keep the receipt slip in a safe place or give it to your buddy.

You will not be allowed to pick up your quilt if you do not have the receipt.

2. Quilt Buddies

If you need someone to take your quilt(s) to RIM or pick them up, please sign the Buddy Sheet on the back table at the Sept meeting. If you find you need a buddy after that date please email or call Madeline Hughes.

Make sure your ID slips are on your quilt and pillowcase properly and you have given the receipt to your Buddy. Please do this before you leave home.

3. Quilts that need special handling

If your quilt requires a special way of wrapping or transporting other than in a pillowcase or it can not have quilts stacked on top of it or requires any other special handling, please sign the Special Handling sheet at the back of the room at the September meeting. You can also email Jan Hember some time **before the show**. jan@hember.name

4. Submitting your quilt(s)

Your quilts are to be taken in at RIM Park between 7:00am and 9:30am on Thurs Oct 17.

Please use the front entrance at RIM only. Use the elevator or the stairs and turn right to the entrance to Forbes Hall.

Quilts should be folded properly with the **slip pinned to the front corner of the quilt which is facing out so when it is folded it is visible. This should be seen as we pull out the quilt.** The other slip is to be pinned to the top of the pillowcase.

If you cannot take your quilt(s) to RIM at the proper time please have a quilt buddy submit it.

Hand your quilt to a volunteer. **Do not** just leave it on a table.

There are still plenty of opportunities to volunteer with the setup and cleanup of the exhibit. Plan to sign up at the September guild meetings.

Procedure for Picking Up Quilts from the Show Saturday October 19 between 5:45pm and 6:30pm

- Please do not arrive at Forbes Hall to pick up your quilts until 5:45pm.
- No quilts will be returned until the entire Exhibit has been taken down.
- When the volunteers are ready, proceed to the tables where the quilts will be arranged in sections alphabetically, by last name. Show your receipt(s). A volunteer will give you your quilt(s). Please be patient.
- NEW in 2019 If you have submitted a quilt that requires special handling, the quilt will not be in alphabetical order at the tables. These quilts will be at the table nearest the ice rink. Nancy Winn and Jan Hember will help you with your quilt(s).
- Go to the checkout table to have your name checked off for receiving your quilt(s).
- Leave Forbes Hall to the left of the Front Servery, present your receipts and quilts to the volunteers at the door. Please do not return to Forbes Hall with your quilt. If you have large containers or bags please be prepared to have them checked for quilts. We really want to make sure that all quilts go home with the correct quilter.
- Proceed to the pillowcase tables where your pillow cases will be in alphabetical order. A volunteer will be there to help you.
- This procedure has been set up in order to assure safe return of your quilt(s). Thank you for your cooperation.



Internet Resources for Quilters

September, for me, is the beginning of a new year, a time for fresh ideas and finding inspiration for new projects. The internet is filled with opportunities to find quilt inspiration and motivation. This month I am sharing some of my favourite sites to find new ideas, challenges, opportunities and most importantly inspiration.

Moda Bakeshop (www.modabakeshop.com) At this site you will find many free patterns for quilts as well as accessories, home décor, bags and totes and so much more. Quilt designers and bloggers (aka Moda Bake Shop Chefs) are invited by Moda Fabrics to post their patterns along with photos and instructions with diagrams, sometimes videos as well as links to their own web pages. Each pattern also highlights whether it is easy, moderate, or challenging, etc. This is a great site to learn some new strategies and approaches, be inspired and perhaps find additional quilt or other sewing items to make!



Pinterest – (<https://www.pinterest.ca>) If you haven't yet discovered Pinterest – now is the time. Pinterest is a social media web and mobile application company. This is an amazing site that provides inspiration in a wide variety of areas, e.g. quilting, sewing, recipes, crafting, photography and so much more. You can create a free account and then begin exploring. This is truly the site to visit if you are looking for inspiration. It is very user friendly. As you become comfortable with the site you can set up your own interest boards, which are like setting up files, e.g. quilting with precuts, log cabin quilts, applique quilts, etc. – and then save the quilts you find so that you can return to them any time. Be prepared to spend hours – because it can become addictive. It's like going down one rabbit hole – and finding a dozen more exciting ones.



Fabric Companies - When fabric companies introduce new fabric lines by their feature designers, many also provide free patterns to accompany the new fabrics. In addition to Moda Fabrics (one of the largest manufacturers) described above, here are some other fabric companies to check out. The free patterns can be applied to any of your favourite fabrics.





Member Challenge



EXCITING OPPORTUNITY!

2020 CQA/ACC Member Guild Challenge



Calling all member guilds! Here is the news about the exciting challenge for next year. CQA/ACC wants to share everyone's sense of adventure as *Quilt Canada* travels north to Edmonton, AB! Join in the fun with your guild—your quilt could end up at *Quilt Canada 2020*!

Once individual quilts are made, each CQA/ACC member guild will select only one winner from their guild's membership before April 15, 2020, for entry into this challenge. All entries must follow the guidelines below.

- Open to CQA/ACC member guilds.
- Guilds wishing to enter the challenge must advise their intent to enter via email to Heather Black, h_black@sympatico.ca by March 1, 2020, so space allocation for display at *Quilt Canada 2020* can be arranged.
- Once the guild selects the quilt to represent their guild, the online entry form must be filled out and submitted by April 15, 2020. The online entry form will be located on the *Quilt Canada 2020* guild challenge page on www.canadianquilter.com. The form will be available March 1, 2020.
- Once the online entry form is received by CQA/ACC, a confirmation email with instructions for shipping the quilt will be sent to the guild email address supplied on the entry form.

THE CHALLENGE

THEME *Gateway to Adventure*

- Each quilt must have a visible amount of Kona® cotton, colour K001-147 Jungle, along with three (3) additional fabrics on the face of the quilt. The additional fabrics can be a print or solid.
- Quilt perimeter to be no larger than 72 inches.

- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow-case style.
- Must include a hanging sleeve, at least three inches wide, for display purposes.
- Must have a quilt label on back with quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.



- All quilts must be received by May 30, 2020, to be displayed at *Quilt Canada 2020*, June 18 to 20, at the Shaw Centre, Edmonton, AB.
- The winning quilt will be selected by Viewers' Choice ballot during *Quilt Canada 2020* and awarded a \$100 cash prize.
- All submitted quilts will remain in the possession of the CQA/ACC for approximately 11 months and will be returned to the owner/maker prior to *Quilt Canada 2021*.

CQA/ACC plans to tour these challenge quilts as part of a travelling show within Canada. Our Regional Representatives and/or Board directors will take the quilts to guilds and shops in their province to share the talents of our guild members.

Take up the challenge and set off on an adventure!



Please refrain from wearing perfume to guild meetings as some members are allergic or sensitive to them.


Block of the Month




