



In June, the guild was contacted by Robin McLean, the Community Development Coordinator for The Arthritis Society's Central West Ontario Division. She was looking for individuals and/or groups to help her raise funds for The Arthritis Society and to spread awareness about the physical and emotional journeys of the 4.6 million Canadians living with arthritis. She thought that surely, if 1 in 5 people have arthritis, some of them must be quilters! She didn't know then that her email would go directly to someone with a sympathetic ear.

Recently Robin and I chatted about lives that are impacted by arthritis. She told me about a recent grant awarded by The Society to Dr. Lihi Eder (Toronto) who is examining the linkage between psoriatic arthritis and heart disease, and ways to identify and assist high-risk patients. The grant is one of many just announced as part of The Society's funding commitment for arthritis research: \$4.82 million, spanning 23 projects across Canada. We also talked about the need for education, the need for others to understand what having arthritis means, and the importance of The Society's motto: *We have arthritis. It doesn't have us!*

Our conversation moved on to how we can help by creating a quilt. Funds raised by a WCQG/Arthritis Society project will directly support high-impact research by scientists and clinicians searching for the causes of, and cure for, arthritis. They will also support the researchers doing transformative work uncovering the best ways to treat and manage arthritis right now.

Robin hopes that the quilters who take part in this project will share their own stories, as I did with her. Perhaps they have arthritis themselves, or their spouses, or their children. Those shared stories will live on in every stitch, and one day find a place in someone's home. Her hope is that as the finished quilt will travel around the province, it will help to tell those stories, to connect arthritis sufferers, and inspire others to learn about life with arthritis.

Judy Pearce and I have agreed to take on this project. We are in the midst of planning the quilt and hope to have kits prepared by the November meetings. Early in 2017 we will schedule a workday to assemble and get it to Aline Chan, who has kindly agreed to quilt it for us. *The guild will be responsible for the quilt, but not for the fundraising.* We thank you in advance for your participation.



I work at the St Jacobs Antiques Market. A set decorator was in the store looking for props, and when she mentioned quilting to another employee, he pointed her to me. I said I could make a ‘Tree of Paradise’ quilt and I know someone who can help me (Sorry, Eileen).

“How about one month?”

“Sure.”

“Can you make two quilts?”

“Sure.”

Little did I know that there would be numerous meetings and opinions which would change the details of the quilt fabric, colour, design, size and time lines many times over. After sewing, un-sewing, re-sewing, etc., etc., we were finally done—we thought. It was quilted and appliqued.

“Sorry, we want the snakes longer with a white strip on the border. We would also like a different binding.”

“When?”

“Friday.” (It was Thursday when this came up.)

I briefly considered driving away and never coming back until I pulled myself together and negotiated for Monday. After three days of late-night quilting, whimpering, paper-piecing, whimpering, and appliquing, we delivered the quilt to the set in Brampton and got to watch some filming.

We had already been to the studio in Toronto to teach actress Sarah Gadon how to piece. She was very sweet and called our sessions “crafternoons”. I can’t wait to tell you about more sewing escapades while on location in St. George as “quilt technicians”. Onto the second quilt, a log cabin. More to come.


Announcing Quilt Canada 2018 - Vancouver B.C.

Monkeys from A to Z has full-colour pages of improbable monkey "occupations", from an Adventurous Astronaut to a Zany Zookeeper.




There are bonus pages of things to search for, and instructions for making sock monkeys, all for a mere \$20.00! The entire proceeds of the book sales go to the SLF.

Operation Christmas Child

In 2015, 386,060 shoe boxes were sent from the Waterloo Region Processing Centre. The number of gift-filled shoe boxes sent from Canada totalled 730,577. Internationally, Operation Christmas Child collected 11 million gift boxes and delivered them to children in more than 100 countries.

They can make use of the following:

- Batting, small and large pieces of fabric
- Craft items: ribbons, paints, greeting cards, stickers, needlework (even partially completed) and basically everything that can be used for crafts
- New clothing
- Jewelry of all kinds, especially beads
- Toys, hand tools and school supplies
- Knitting and crochet materials, wool, needles, embroidery floss
- Safety pins, straight pins, sewing needles, thread, buttons, fasteners, lace, rickrack, trim, elastic (all widths), zippers, Velcro, scissors, sewing kits
- Marbles





