



Library Book Workshop - Karen Eckmeier's "Happy Villages" #2


Let's do it again! This time we'll gather around another of our library books, Karen Eckmeier's "Happy Villages". This is a REALLY fun technique that is doable in a day (except for the quilting). Just like Carol Ann Waugh's "Stupendous Stitching", it doesn't take a huge amount of thinking...just fun. Here is a link to a youtube video of Karen's technique.

<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gUqtM8bVi0> She demonstrates another of her techniques first ("Accidental Landscapes") so you'll need to fast forward to 13 minutes to begin the "Happy Villages" portion. Her "Accidental Landscapes" would be fun for a future workshop.

This repeat workshop will be held on **Friday October 12, 2018** at the Mannheim Community Centre. **The cost is \$20.00**, payable before the workshop.

Here is a supply list:

- A piece of background fabric, whatever size you'd like to make (any fabric will do). I'd recommend starting with a piece no larger than about 15" x 20". Smaller may be better.
- Small scraps of fabric to make houses, roofs, windows, doors
- Sky fabric, if you choose to have a sky (it's up to you)
- Water fabric, if you choose to have water
- Mountain or rock fabric, if you want them in your village
- Small bits of green fabric for trees
- White glue or a glue stick
- Tulle to cover your piece before quilting. It is nice to audition different colours, so I will bring a variety of colours so you can audition them after making your piece. I'll have a donation bucket there for loose change if you choose to use what I bring
- Batting and backing to fit your piece
- Thread for quilting and detail
- Safety pins for basting
- Your sewing machine, but leave it in the car until the end of the day, so there's more table space available throughout the day





Quilting With Rulers for Domestic Sewing Machines

Workshop 9:30-3:30

Saturday, November 17

with Robin Bogaert



This workshop is designed to teach you to understand how to work with the new and very popular rulers for domestic sewing machines including such brands as **Westalee, Hand-i-quilter, Bernina, Angela Walters** and more. You will be shown how to master setting up your sewing machine and ruler foot. Long arm quilters use rulers and now you can too! Handouts and tips for success will be shared along with step-by-step instructions for each ruler. Demonstrations and practice time will be allowed for students to create additional patterns to make the most of their rulers.



Supply List for Rulers Workshop

- Sewing machine in good working order
- The ability to lower your feed dogs and free motion quilt with your machine
- RULER FOOT for low shank or high shank (please insure you have the correct one for your machine.) **Bernina owners will need to get a ruler foot from a Bernina dealer.**
- Minimum of 2 domestic machine quilting rulers of your choice (Robin will show you how to use an assortment of rulers, including but not limited to: **Westlea** (inside designs and outside design template style, straight edge, curved edge and spiralling), **Handi Quilter** machine quilting rulers, **Angela Walters & Bernina** domestic quilting rulers., featuring demonstration style teaching.
- Extension table for your machine (makes it easier to quilt)
- Eight to twelve 12" x 12' Quilt sandwiches, solid coloured, 100% cotton fabric (front, backing and batting)
- 40 or 50 weight thread in contrast to your fabric (we want you to be able to see your stitches and tension)
- Mark B Gone or Frixion marking pens, note pad or paper and pen, machine quilting needles size 75-80
- Quilting gloves and supreme slider (**recommended**), ruler grips (optional) 505 Basting spray (optional) or quilt basting pins, 6" x 24" ruler, rotary cutter
- Your lunch and enthusiasm 😊

- All entries must follow the guidelines below. Each individual Member Guild may select **one winner only** from their Guild's membership, on or before April 30, 2019 for entry into this challenge.
- Guilds wishing to enter the Challenge must advise of their intent via email to Bonnie Rankin, rankinbon@gmail.com by Feb 1, 2019, so that space allocation can be arranged.
- All mini quilts must be received by May 15 - May 25, 2019 so they can be displayed at QC 2019, at the EY Centre in Ottawa. **Bonnie Rankin**, CQA/ACC Past President will receive the quilts at **235 Mojave Cres, Stittsville, ON., K2S 0H6. Tel: 613-435-0238 email: rankinbon@gmail.com**
- The winning quilt will be selected by Viewer's Choice during Quilt Canada 2019 and awarded a \$100 cash prize.
- All submitted quilts will remain in the possession of the CQA for approx. 11 months and will be returned to the owner/maker prior to Quilt Canada June 2020, in Edmonton.
- The CQA/ACC plans to take these quilts, as part of a travelling show, across Canada. Our Regional Reps and/or Board members will take the quilts to Guilds in their area to share the talents of our members.



The Challenge:

- **The Theme:** “Quilting Goes Viral.”
- Please use **Pantone, colour #18**, Ultraviolet (the 2018 Colour of the year), or the equivalent **KONA** colour, Bright **Periwinkle**, along with up to two (2) additional colours on the face of your quilt
- The quilt perimeter is to be **no larger than 72 inches**.
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow case style.
- Please ensure that there is a **hanging sleeve**, at least 3 inches wide, for display purpose.
- All quilts must have a **label** with the Quilt name and Quilter's name visible on it.
- Please enclose the **Guild Entry Form** when your quilt is shipped.

We look forward to your entry and thank you for your participation. Please send some photos of some of your Guild entries for posting on our Social Media sites. Most of all, have fun!

Quilt

2018

Part One

There are 4 parts – and it's very easy to make. For beginners this will be a good learning quilt, for more experienced quilters it'll be quick and fun.

Size: This project can be made in two different sizes – either a queen, 84" x 84", or you can make it smaller at 38" x 38" for a wall quilt or baby quilt.

Fabrics: You will be using 3 fabrics which will be labeled "A", "B" and "C".

Fabric "A" is the main focal fabric and should be medium in colour value (not very dark and not very light). If you're making the queen size quilt it will be more interesting if you choose a boldly designed fabric or interesting multi-coloured batik. Fabric designs could be flowers, animals, trees, etc. If your quilt were only black-grey-white this colour "A" would be the grey.

Fabric "B" is the "black" fabric (if choosing only black-grey-white) It could be chosen as the deepest colour you can find in the "A" Fabric. It should be a deep colour: navy, deep teal, deep maroon, etc. Contrast is important. The quilt will be MUCH more interesting if this "B" fabric is made up of several different fabrics in the same colour family for a scrappy look.

Fabric "C" This is the "light and bright" colour – it can be a wild colour seen in the "A" fabric or anything you think will go and be the "eye catcher". Again, several fabrics in a scrappy effect will look good. Several light but bright lime yellows? A few light cherry magentas? It will also look good with several whites or light creams. Study your "A" fabric to pick this highlight fabric.

How Much Fabric?

This quilt will work well with FQ's but check your own stash before you buy.

Fabric "A" – 2.5 yds

Fabric "B" – 12 FQ's or 3 yds

Fabric "C" – 1 yd

Remember "B" and "C" will have a better look if you choose more than one fabric in the same colour family.

If you're making the smaller quilt 38" x 38" buy only a little over ¼ the number of FQ's shown. (A=3, B=4 and C=1)

*****The 38" x 38" could be made into a Smile Quilt.*****

Here is a brief job description. **For more information contact Judy Pearce.**

Being a committee member includes the following:

- Three committee meetings a year, one in the fall, one in January and one for review after the sale in June.
- Helping with quilt intake which happens during the daytime for about three weeks at the beginning of March. One day includes setting the order of the sale
- Photography day: we have a group of helpers come in and we take photos of all the quilts for the website and catalogue. We bring a lunch to serve all our volunteers
- Proof reading the catalogue at the New Hamburg Independent in April
- Relief Sale Promotion Dinner: most of the committee goes and helps to take tickets, hand out catalogues and generally help with the dinner
- Possibly helping to get quilts to venues to display them in May
- Helping to deliver catalogues in May
- About a week and a half before the sale, typing quilt information into computers at MR Jutzi for a morning
- Friday: helping put the quilts up at the sale
- Helping with the Friday night auction
- Helping on Sale day with a variety of things
