“New York Beauty State of Mind”


We are excited to welcome Linda Hahn of Palm Bay, Florida, as our speaker for the February meeting. Linda will be presenting her most requested lecture, “New York Beauty State of Mind”, which will include quilts from each of the three books in her ‘New York Beauty’ series as well as others that will be coming in the next series. There will be traditional settings, modern settings, and even whimsical quilts—something for everyone.

Linda has developed a unique technique to create the New York Beauty block—and it takes away all of the stress of “points” and “curves”. You won’t want to make just one block! She is truly passionate about this block and her enthusiasm shows through in her presentation.



Linda will also discuss some aspects of the publishing process. It’s amazing to hear how quilt books go from “concept” to “quilter”, and all the processes, including ‘must be adhered to’ timelines.


Linda is the author of 9 books, several of which are award winners. She is a guest designer with Banyan Batiks (Northcott) and is releasing her third collection this year, “Island Vibes 2”. She is an EQ Artist and has designed an add-on program for EQ8 to coordinate with one of her books. In 2009, Linda was named the NQA’s Certified Teacher of the Year. 





FEBRUARY WORKSHOP



Scrappy Carpenter's Star with Michelle Crawford

Saturday February 19, 2022

9:30am to 12:30pm

Fee: \$45

Now open to non-members

Michelle describes this class as a “technique class”, where participants will become increasingly comfortable working with small pieces as they will work with 1” wide scrap strips. This is a template-free quilt pattern constructed by sewing strips to strips, sub-cutting and then sewing them back together to create the 12” square finished block. This can become a 47” square wall hanging where 5 blocks are sewn in one colour way, and the other 4 blocks are created in a complementary colour way. Once the blocks are sewn together, there will be a large ‘open’ area for hand or machine quilting to complement the design. A scrappy piano key type border is added after a frame border to complete the quilt. Michelle will share a variety of strategies to help participants gain confidence in cutting and sewing small pieces accurately. She recommends making one block during the class as a sample which can be used for a variety of purposes—and then perhaps move on to use this technique to construct additional blocks to make the wall hanging or quilt. The class fee includes the cost of the pattern.

APRIL WORKSHOP



Wicked Wahini with Linda J. Hahn

Wicked Wahini is Linda's most popular workshop by far. The pattern incorporates the New York Beauty block into a larger Carpenter's Square block.

These are NO SET-IN SEAMS.

Linda will teach us her ONE PIN technique for creating perfect New York Beauty blocks, and then how to put this quilt together. As we move through the class, Linda will demonstrate how to use the scraps and cutaways to

make an optional miniature version. The purchase of a kit is required for the workshop which is included in the cost of the workshop. A bulk order will be purchased to ensure delivery and reduce the cost of shipping and handling. Join us for a day of learning new techniques.




4. Add to Cart and click the checkout button.
5. When you get to the checkout page:
 - A. Review your cart to make sure you have the right number of IQD registrations in your cart.
 - B. Provide your email address so we can contact you with the Zoom link and
 - C. If desired, choose an express method of payment
 - D. Click the blue Place Order button.
6. Tuck your order confirmation in a safe place so you can review it on the big day. Please check 'Junk', 'Spam' and other mailbox folders for your confirmation email. If you do not receive an order confirmation, you did not complete the registration process. Please make sure to complete the process including a valid email address.

To Submit Your Quilts for the Virtual Quilt Show

Members of the sponsoring guilds and paying guests are welcome to submit up to two quilts each to the virtual quilts show. Please be prepared to provide the following information about your quilt(s):

- Quilt name
- Pattern designer
- Quilter, if other than yourself
- An artist's statement or brief history of quilt. (Limit of 50 words)
- Up to five photos for each quilt. We recommend an overall view of the quilt, along with several close-ups of interesting details.

Quilt show submissions will close on February 5, 2022.

Internet Resources for Quilters

Do you have a Smart phone on which you have apps? Perhaps you have some games or maybe you have joined the millions who are enjoying the newest game that has generated so much interest - "Wordle". Periodically, we have shared some useful quilting apps. I recently became aware of some quilting apps that you might find interesting and helpful. The first two will provide great support for taking and editing photos before submitting them for Show and Share, and the last one on the page is a MUST HAVE for all quilters.

SKRWT - (pronounce "screw it") is a powerful photo editing app which costs \$1.99 from the App Store (Apple). It is also available for other platforms, e.g. Android. This app allows you to take a photo and edit it to make it into a square or rectangle, e.g. when taking a photo of a quilt and the photo looks narrower at one end. This app allows you to edit it to a rectangle, just by clicking and dragging. It's possible to fix different types of perspective distortions. It does one thing and it does it exceptionally well. A new version (1.5) was just released in January. If you are taking a photo of your quilt to submit for Show and Share, and the top of the photo is wider than the bottom, this app will allow you to easily and simply correct the photo. It's also possible to crop, flip or rotate the photo.



SnapSeed - is similar to SKRWT. It is a free photo-editing app, available for Android or iOS. You can take photos in the app and edit them, or edit photos already in your camera roll. One particularly handy aspect of SnapSeed is how easy it is to undo, revise or change the work you've done. It is a free app.

Colorscape - This is another amazing app, which turns photos into colouring pages, making the photo look like a drawing. It will take any image and create an outline from it that you can colour in on your computer screen, on paper or both. Take a picture of anything, anyone, anywhere and instantly you can create a blank canvas to which you can add any colour or shade you wish. Jean Impey is a quilter from California. She uses this technique to make portraits. You can visit her website to see her portraits (sewjean.com) or click on the link provided here to see how she makes quilted cards using this app. If you like to quilt collages or portraits, you might like to try this app.





Quilter's Little Helper by Robert Kaufman - I use this free app all the time. Have you found yourself at the quilt store wondering how much backing or batting to purchase for a specific sized quilt, e.g. 70 x 90 inches? Simply open this app on your phone, enter the dimensions of the quilt and it automatically generates the amount of backing, batting, or even the binding you'll need to purchase. It's also a great tool to share when the customer in line in front of you is having difficulty determining how much fabric to purchase. You will wow them with your tech skills when you use this app.





1. Open the guild website: <https://www.wcquiltersguild.on.ca/>




2. Scroll down to Library Inventory

3. See Menu Bar, on the far right side: Search this library, then click the down arrow to reveal “search all fields”.




4. Click “All fields”
