
# Carol Wilhoit - "Hexagon: Six Sides, One Angle, and Oh, So Many Possibilities

We are delighted to have Carol Wilhoit join us from Illinois, USA, for our January guild meeting! Carol will present her lecture and slide show, "Hexagons: Six Sides, One Angle, and Oh, So Many Possibilities." The hexagon is successfully used in both traditional and contemporary quilts. The unique six-sided geometry of the hexagon makes it exceptionally versatile! While hexagons can be arranged in interesting patterns, they can also be created from other shapes, such as triangles and diamonds. Quilted hexagon pieces can incorporate many techniques, including machine piecing, hand piecing, English Paper Piecing (by hand or machine), fussy cutting, embroidery, and quilting.

During forty years of quilting, Carol has become interested in making small quilted projects, as well as quilts. As a retired physician, she enjoys bringing her technical mind to quilting. She likes to find ways to make the construction process easier, while producing better results. She has also refined techniques for building, organizing, and using a stash that make it a joy to have and use. She enjoys free motion quilting, quilting with a walking foot, and using metallic thread for quilting.

Carol has been teaching quilting classes for more than ten year, including teaching at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, and at the Great Wisconsin Quilt Show. She loves sharing her knowledge and ideas with others, and encouraging students as they try new projects and techniques.

One of her favorite aspects of teaching is seeing students succeed at com-





Want to try something new? We invite you to participate in our Library

Learning Challenge, and your name will go into a draw at the end

to win one free "Sewing Together But Apart" day.

Come to the library at any Gatherings and here's what you do:

- 1. Pick a technique from the first bag. The techniques are modern, embellishments, book plus tools, appliqué, paper piecing, design, art, and machine quilting.
- 2. You may have a second chance to pick a technique if it really isn't what you'd like to learn, or if you already know how and want to learn something new.
- 3. Pick a fat quarter from the second bag—to be incorporated into the project you make learning this new technique.
- 4. You can take out an 'extra' book to help you, and it may also help you pick a project. (For example, if you already have 3 books you want to borrow and you pick "Appliqué", you can add one book from the Appliqué tag.)
- 5. Make a gift or something for Outreach—project size can be as small as a placemat or up to a teddy bear or lap quilt (max. perimeter 200").
- 6. Challenge will run from September 2023 to April 2024—watch the weekly update email, guild website, and monthly newsletters for updates.

Once your "Learning" is finished, send a picture to Kathy Bissett for the next month's 'Show and Share', making sure you state the item pictured is part of the "Library Learning Challenge". Be sure to include what you learned, and if you would use this technique again, along with the book from which you drew inspiration. Share if it was easier or harder than you thought. After the item has been shown at the monthly Zoom meeting, there will be one ballot entered in the draw. Entries must be received by April 14, 2024 for the April Zoom meeting to qualify for the draw. Remember the fun of gathering doilies, coloured paper, scissors, markers, and glue to make Valentines? Experience the same joy of Valentine making, this time with ingredients of fabric, batting, and thread, using your sewing machine with a walking foot, dual feed, or even a regular pressure foot. You will learn a variety of ways to quilt a heart, and then use your hearts to make mug rugs that are perfect Valentines. Trimming the extra batting around the heart makes the heart three-dimensional, an extra special touch, known as trapunto. The designs and techniques used in class can also be used for larger quilts, so you should leave with some completed Valentines, and

with ideas that you can use to quilt your next quilt.
