



Margaret was an extremely skilled, innovative and prolific quilt maker, who adapted the traditional media and techniques of quilt making to tell her life story. On September 4, 2019, Margaret lost her courageous battle with cancer, and these quilts remain as treasured family heirlooms and an artistic legacy. Together, her quilts form a kind of chronicle, set down in collage-like quilts that weave together the objects, animals, books, people, places and ideas that shaped her family's stories.  "When my mother died in February 2016, I decided to make a quilted wall hanging in her memory. Mum loved flowers and growing





## Internet Resources for Quilters

Did this holiday season make you the proud owner of a new smart phone? Or perhaps you have had a smart phone for some time and are wondering how this device might benefit you and your quilting hobby. There are quilting "apps" out there designed to make your quilting life easier. Many quilting apps can help you calculate fabric requirements to apps that help you picture your fabric stash on a quilt pattern and so much more. These "techy" tools can help to transform your quilting life with just a few taps of your iPhone or Android phone. Listed below are some of my favourite apps. I use the iPhone, but these apps are also available for the Android.

### QuiltingCalc

I use this free app regularly – truly my favourite one! This suite of quilting calculators from Robert Kaufman Fabrics is essential for any quilter. Complete with 8 of the most-needed quilting calculators and converts, this Apple and Android app takes the guesswork out of buying and cutting fabric. Calculators included: Fabric Measurement Converter, Backing and Batting Calculator (my favourite!), Piece Count Calculator, Pieces to Area Calculator, Binding Calculator, Border Calculator, Square-in-a-Square Calculator, Set-in and Corner Triangle Calculator. Makes the "math of quilting" so much easier!



### Missouri Star Quilt Company

This free app available for both your phone and iPad - from the [Missouri Star Quilting Company](#) provides hundreds of free in-app tutorials and patterns. Updated weekly, this is a great download for quilters who love the Missouri Star Quilting Company. While many people follow Jenny Doan on the internet, this quilting app provides easy access on your phone (or iPad) at any time, any place to the many tutorials, patterns, fabrics, etc. Put it next to your sewing machine – watch/ listen to a tutorial while sewing.



### Star Stash Fabric

Have you ever wanted to carry your fabric stash with you so that you can purchase additional fabrics to enhance those that you already own? This app helps you organize and track your collection of fabric. When you're shopping, know which fabrics you already own and how much. You can take a picture of your fabric, record the name and its primary colours. Enter details about the fabric, such as the pattern size, fabric content, etc. You can also record where and when you purchased the fabric, where it's currently stored, etc. Go to your app store to learn more about this powerful app and how it can support you.



**Need Help with your iPhone?** If you are new to using an iPhone, and would like some *coaching* in learning more about what your phone can do for you, my husband – Lew Ford – coaches seniors one on one (free of charge) on how to use the iPhone. He has helped many seniors become much more comfortable with and excited about the possibilities of using the iPhone. 


## Using Up Scraps #24 with Vikki MacDonald

### Disappearing Double Nine-Patch




This block begins with a simple 9-patch where colour placement is important. The centre patch must be different than the other two colours. The squares for the 9-patch can be cut any size, but a minimum of 4" is recommended.



The simple 9-patch is cut through the centre vertically and horizontally.

Measure your new mini blocks and cut 5 square patches that size, with the A patches a new colour and the centre B patch being another colour. Assemble this new 9-patch, which will be cut through the centre vertically and horizontally into four new blocks.



The resulting blocks can be arranged any way log cabin blocks can be arranged. Make a quilt top, table runner, placemat, etc.



Vikki's added diagonal rows of solid blocks in various colours to her quilt as illustrated to the right. Note the orientation of the pieced blocks.

Allow me to introduce the Ailsa Craig Quilt & Fibre Arts Festival. The festival is an international event that sees this tiny village in southwestern Ontario, Canada, bring fibre artists from visiting countries to display over 120 quilts and fibre art works of exceptional international quality. The visiting fibre artists teach workshops throughout the week, walk the show to converse with guests, are billeted by local townspeople and generally get a wonderful taste of life in North Middlesex while sharing their rich culture with our guests.

**Our guest country for 2020 will be Spain.**

We would like to extend an invitation to attend the second Quilt and Fibre Challenge to be hosted by the Ailsa Craig Quilt & Fibre Arts Festival. We also invite Fibre Artists from across Canada to participate in this challenge to celebrate the culture, flora, fauna, history and geography that comprises Spain. The Challenge "Spain Through Our Eyes" was developed to allow the Festival's many followers to participate fully in the event, even if distance precluded their attendance. All art work will be

on display in the Ailsa Craig Arts Centre and Ye Olde Town Hall during the 2020 Festival and viewed by approximately 3,000 visitors. Thirty fibre art pieces, as selected by visitor voting and our Spain guests, will be forwarded to Spain where they will participate in a travelling show. An additional Canadian Travelling Trunk Show may also be established.



## Block of the Month

## Whirling Geese



**Skill Level** CONFIDENT BEGINNER  
**Finished Size** 9" x 9"

**Red Fabric** 4 rectangles 3 1/2" x 6 1/2"  
**Black** 1 square 3 1/2"  
**Black Print** 8 squares 3 1/2"

## Assembling the Block

**Step 1** -- Draw diagonal line on wrong side of black print 3 1/2" square. Referring to **Diagram I**, place marked square on red rectangle, right sides together, aligning raw edges. Stitch on drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Open and press. Repeat on opposite corner to make pieced rectangle. Make 4.




Diagram I Make 4

**Step 2** -- Referring to **Diagram II**, join pieced rectangle and black square using a partial seam. Sew from edge to the middle of black square and backstitch.

**Step 3** -- Add 2 more pieced rectangles (**Diagram III**).

**Step 4** -- Join last pieced rectangle along long side. Sew from outside of block to partial seam created in **Step 1** to create Whirling Geese Block (**Diagram IV**).



## MCC KIT BAG INSTRUCTIONS

### FABRIC GUIDELINES

- Please use a firm, cotton or cotton blend woven fabric — broadcloth is too light, denim or corduroy is too heavy.
- The same guidelines about images on fabric for comforters apply to kit bags — no pigs, military images, flags or religious symbols.
- Please make sure the ties and fabric are good quality, we hope the bags will be in good shape for years to come!

**Fabric:** Cut one piece 12 in x 38 in

**Cord:** Cut two lengths 33 in *Please make sure cord won't fray with repeated use. Depending on the fiber content, please knot or melt the ends.*

### SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

1

Fold edge of fabric in 3/8 in on all sides and stitch a narrow hem.

2

Fold down 2 in on the two short sides and stitch 1/8 in away from the fold and the edge to make the drawstring casing.

3

Fold bag in half, wrong side in. Stitch bag sides from casing seam to bottom fold close to the edge.

4

Pass a cord through the casing, starting and ending on the same side. Repeat on the other side. Tie off cords.

**Finished bag size:** 11¾ x 16¾ in

**Fabric:** 12½ x 38 in

**Cord:** 33 in for each drawstring (cut 2)

*Please remember to backstitch all seams.*


