niques to reinterpret traditional designs. Her work incorporates a multitude of three-dimensional elements, such as Yo-Yos, Prairie Points, wool felt, appliquéd and pieced denim, doilies, and trims. Whimsical, creative, colourful, and exhuberant are words often used to describe her distinctive style.


Racheldaisy's quilts have received numerous international awards, including several 'Best in Show' accolades, recognition for 'Best Use of Colour', 'Most Innovative', and 'Viewer's Choice'. Her quilts have been exhibited and awarded in fine art exhibitions, and featured in national and international magazines,

and her book "Whizz Bang - Adventures with Folded Fabric Quilts", has inspired quilters around the world.

Teaching and sharing her quilts

with other quilters is an absolute joy for Racheldaisy. She aims to inspire others, whether they are beginners or advanced sewers, to embrace different techniques, and to prove that patchwork and quilting doesn't have to have rules.

- The envelope must be no larger than  $9'' \times 6''$ , and no thicker than .02'' with the postcard inside (minimum size according to Canada Post is  $5.6'' \times 6.1''$  with a thickness of 0.007'').





Thank you to the many members who made pillows at home and brought the




