


Welcome to the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild's November 2023 Virtual Show and Share.


Thank you to these talented quilters who have shared their current projects.




**Bonnie Murdoch**




The books that I used are:


- 1. PS I Love You (Baby Collection ) 1990 by Lynda Milligan and Nancy Smith.
- 2. Better Homes and Gardens Magazine 2001. American Patchwork and Quilting. I used this book to learn how to make a pillow case.

**Downtown** was my entry in a challenge. Three song titles were listed and I chose *Downtown* by Petula Clark. I used of Gloria Loughman's tile technique from her book *Radiant Landscapes*.
