2023 WCQG Quilt Exhibit on October 13 and 14

I The excitement is building—it's almost time for our first quilt exhibit in 4 years. Below are a few reminders which will help to make the preparations for the exhibit go smoothly:

- 1. If possible, check out these tables at Gatherings on October 4 at Albert McCormick Community Centre.
 - pick up the ID form for your quilt/quilts from Madeline Hughes or Marg Sandiford
 - sign up for a volunteer position at the Quilt Exhibit with Linda Henderson
 - hand in items for the Boutique to Ev Cameron or Leah Mitchell
 - give your small quilt to Pat Lockyer or Judy Pearce for the Mini Quilt Draw.
 - inform **Madeline Hughes** if your quilt requires **special handling** or you are asking someone else to drop off or pick up your quilt.
- 2. Fill out the ID form for each of the quilts which you have registered for the exhibit. Pin it with 2 safety pins to the bottom right corner on the back of your quilt. Fold the quilt so the label appears on the top. If you unable to attend Gatherings, ask a friend to pick up your ID form(s). ID forms that are not picked up on October 4 will be available from Madeline Hughes when you drop off our quilt at RIM Park between 6:30am and 9am on Thursday, October 12. If you are providing a rod, please label it with your name and the quilt number.
- 3. Please contact Madeline Hughes in advance, if your quilt requires special handling.
- I 4. Drop off your quilt at RIM Park on Thursday, October 12, starting at 6:30am. All quilts must be at RIM Park by
 I 9:00am in order to be included in the exhibit. Please bring your rod at this time as well.
- 5. Arrange to pick up your quilt at RIM Park at 7:00pm on Saturday evening, October 14.

If you are unable to pick up your quilt, please see Madeline Hughes either at the October 4 Gatherings, or when your quilt is dropped off at RIM Park on Thursday morning to fill out a form designating the person who will be picking up your quilt. Be sure to also add that person's name to the ID form on your quilt.




OCTOBER PROGRAM - WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2023

7PM ET on Zoom 'The Quilted Landscape' with Gloria Loughman



We are delighted to have Gloria Loughman join us from Victoria, Australia, for our October guild meeting! Gloria will present her lecture and slide show, 'The Quilted Landscape'. Have you thought about making a quilt to capture your memories of a special place? Perhaps a wonderful holiday destination, a view from your lounge room window or a memory of a special place from childhood. No matter what the inspiration, creating a landscape quilt is an achievable project. The process combines



Gloria's initiation into the world of patchwork occurred nearly 30 years ago when she was recovering from a course of chemotherapy for breast cancer. After completing some studies in design and colour, as part of a Diploma of Art in 1996, she began to make large vivid

I landscape quilts, depicting the Australian bush.

Having the opportunity to travel to many unique and fascinating parts of the continent, she is continually challenged to reproduce these images in fabric. In more recent times, her landscapes have become more abstract as she played with pattern and colour. Her series of quilts based on buildings and other façades is a result of a love of architecture and her opportunity to travel and explore, photographing many fascinating buildings. Underlying all of her work is a passion for colour and the ongoing challenge of capturing light in her work.

Most of the textiles have been hand dyed or painted, and feature extensive machine embroidery.

Gloria has had a number of solo exhibitions, and many of her quilts have won many major awards in Australia, Europe, Japan, and the United States. Gloria is also the author of four books, *Luminous Landscapes*, *Quilted Symphony*, *Radiant Landscapes* and *Fabulous Facades*.

What began as a therapy has developed into a passion, and has given Gloria the opportunity to travel the world exhibiting her quilts, teaching classes, and meeting lots of wonderful people! Gloria is married to her husband Tony, a very keen and talented photographer, so Gloria is never short of inspiration for her work. Gloria has three daughters and nine grandchildren.

Fold It, Snip It Challenge

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Fold It, Snip It Challenge at the September Gatherings. Some of you did not receive printed instruction. Below are the instructions on how to complete the challenge:

- 1. Fold the fabric you received from the event and take a photo of the pile; save this photo to be submitted with a photo of your finished project.
- 2. Take the fabric you received from the event and create anything you like, a quilt, a hanging, a bag, placemats, table runner, etc.
- You must use at least a piece of each of the fabrics you obtained from the event, however you do not need to use all of the fabric you received.
- 4. You may add up to 1/4 metre of one additional fabric of your choosing for the top.
- 5. You may also use additional fabric of your choosing for the binding and the backing (they can differ from each other if you choose).
- 6. The challenge must be made completely by you, including the quilting.
- 7. Send a photo of the fabric before you use it, and a photo of the finished product, to Kathy Bissett by December 1, 2023.
- 8. HAVE FUN!!!



Library Learning Challenge

Want to try something new? We invite you to participate in our Library Learning Challenge, and your name will go into a draw at the end to win one free 'Sewing Together But Apart' day.

Come to the library at any of the fall Gatherings and here is what you'll do:

- Pick a technique from the first bag (a list will be posted).
- You may have a 2nd chance to pick a technique if it really isn't what you'd like to learn or you already know how and what to learn something new.
- Pick a fat quarter from the second bag—to be incorporated into the project you make learning this new technique.
- You can take out an 'extra' book to help you, and it may also help you pick a project. (For example: if you already have 3 books you want to borrow and you pick "Appliqué", you can add one book from the Appliqué tag.)
- ◆ Make a gift or something for Outreach—project size can be as small as a placemat or up to a teddy bear or lap quilt (max. perimeter 200").
- Challenge will run from September 2023 to April 2024—watch the weekly update email, guild website, and monthly newsletters for updates.

Once your "Learning" is finished, send a picture to Kathy Bissett for the next month's 'Show and Share' (by the Sunday before our monthly guild meeting), making sure you state the item pictured is for the **Library Learning Challenge**. Be sure to include what you learned, and if you would use this technique again. Was it easier or harder than you thought, and mention the book(s) that helped you.

After the item has been shown at the monthly guild meeting, there will be one ballot deposited in the draw. Entries must be received by April 14, 2024, for the April Zoom meeting to qualify for the draw. The winner's name will be drawn at the end of the 'Show and Share' in April and be announced that evening.

- Use card stock for the back (fabric is too difficult to write on).
- Each postcard must be accompanied by a correctly sized envelope that will properly fit the postcard, to insure confidentiality for the recipient.
- The envelope must be no larger than 9" \times 6", and no thicker than .02" with the postcard inside (minimum size according to Canada Post is 5.6" \times 6.1" with a thickness of 0.007").

Please drop off your donations of postcards at Gatherings beginning in October—there will be a labelled basket or box on the sign-in table at the entrance for you to leave your postcards. - Doris Martin.




